PANDEMIC EMERGENCY AND E-LEARNING

Innovative learning and teaching methodology



PANEL's rationale

The Covid-19 pandemic outbreak made it very difficult for people with low IT skills to be active in online training courses. Teachers had to adapt to this new way of training as well. The development of distance learning can, however, provide a decisive input not only to implement important structural measures, but also to spread and increase the level of general digital literacy. The issue of digital skills is crucial both for teachers, who need a wide variety of digital communication tools to teach in the current context, and for lowskilled adults in the IT field, for whom online lessons are more difficult and demanding and training courses more difficult to complete.

PANEL's objectives

The PANEL project wants to address the needs of both teachers and learners, and to turn difficulties into opportunities for social development. The project therefore aims to:

- 1. provide teachers with suggestions and IT tools to overcome difficulties in e-learning environment;
- 2. improve training methodologies in e-learning environment in the areas of: foreign language learning, art workshops, physical and mental well-being, ICT;
- 3. motivate low-skilled adults in the IT field to be active in e-learning environments.

The PANEL project has officially started the 1st of February 2022 for 28 months but was kicked-off in Modiin (Israel) the 13th and 14th of March 2022.

The meeting was held in a hybrid format since some of the partners were not able to physically join the kick-off meeting.

The first project result was discussed among partners, under the lead of Malaga University. The result will be a compiled report as an outcome of national researches conducted in each partner country. The research will be based on questionnaires targeted to both trainers and adult learners needs and well as on an analysis of good practices existing in partner countries in terms of IT tools e-learning environments usage. Partners will then meet in Ferrol, Spain, in October 2022 to launch the second project's result.
